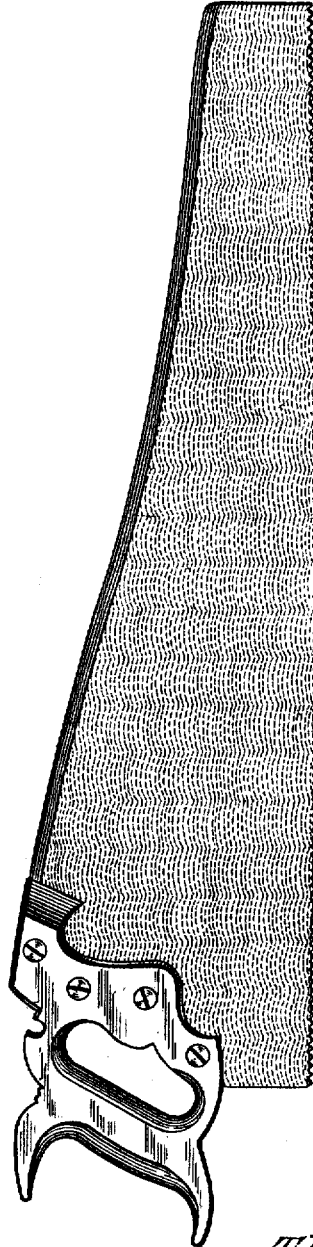

DESIGN FOR A SAW.

SPECIFICATION forming part of **Design No. 25,763**, dated **July 7, 1896**.

Application filed February 25, 1896. Serial No. 580,746. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS L. WALLACE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Indianapolis, in the county of Marion and State of Indiana, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Saws, of which the following is a specification.

The object of my said invention is to produce a new design for the surface ornamentation of saws, whereby they are rendered highly attractive in appearance.

Said design consists in a saw the surface of which is covered with wavy or irregular lines, as indicated in the accompanying drawing, which shows a hand-saw the side of which has said ornamental pattern or design

thereon, which may be formed thereon in any desired manner, as, for instance, by grinding or by etching.

Having thus fully described my said invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A saw provided with the ornamental pattern substantially as herein shown and described.
